An Introduction to the Study of History

History is the study of the human experience in all its facets. The purpose of historical study is to not only acquire an understanding of “what happened” but also to develop an appreciation and understanding of how and why developments unfolded the way they did. Our program is multi-disciplinary and informed by voices from diverse groups. The study of history will inform and guide your reasoning about human behavior both now and in your future. It will provide a strong foundation for diverse careers and graduate education in areas such as law, politics, and public history. The program will challenge you to think analytically and critically, develop research skills, and learn to communicate more effectively.

We encourage students to:

- Declare a major early so that you will become orientated to the discipline while you are still in the formative stages of your program of study.
- Meet with an advisor to discuss the curriculum, select courses and discuss career options.
- Take sets of coherently sequenced history courses of 200-, 300-, and 400-level courses in at least 2 areas of history. (e.g. History of: western civilization, U.S., Asian, Latin American, African, Islam)

The requirements for achieving a B.A. or B.S. degree in History consist of **4 major components**:

1. University Liberal Studies program – 35 hours

You may *not* use HIS courses to fulfill your Liberal Studies requirements.

2. History major – 39 hours

- Western history -- US or Western Civilization*
- Non-Western history - Asian History, Latin American History, African History, or The Islamic World*
- HIS 200 (Historians and the Study of History)
- HIS 300W (Junior level writing requirement)
- HIS 498C (Senior Seminar, research-oriented capstone course)
- Maintain a 3.0 cumulative grade point average in your major courses
- At least 3 other 400-level courses (5 for an extended major)

3. Minor - 18-24 hours

Program of your choice generally of course work in a discipline, or in a multi-disciplinary program such as International Affairs, outside of your major. If you decide not to have a minor, you may opt instead for an **extended major** in History, which adds 18 hours to your “regular” major.

4. Electives - Courses to make up the total of 120 hours required for graduation.

The difference between a BA degree and a BS degree is a 12 hour (3-semester block) requirement of course work in a foreign language. These language study hours are not part of the 39 hour major requirements but you may take them as part of your liberal studies, as electives, or if you choose a foreign-language minor, as part of your minor.

* World History surveys (HIS100&102) may be taken in lieu of either a set of Western history courses or a set of non-Western history courses.

Advising Check Sheet: B.A. / B.S. History Major Requirements

For the BA/BS degree there are **39 credit hours** of required History course work, normally distributed as follows. **No HIS courses** may be used towards your Liberal Studies requirements. You must maintain a 3.0 GPA in your major courses. **Note:** You may choose to develop a thematic (rather than geographical-cultural) concentration, such as social and economic history, women’s history, American-Indian history or ethnic history.
